

List of items to pack for whole family evacuation (return time not known)

questions:

- 1- Can we take two or more vehicles?
- 2- Will the church move our food storage for us?
- 3- Can the church take the contents of the CERT cache?
- 4- Can the dog go?
- 5- Can someone take the complete scout trailer for those people without camping supplies?

food storage and other things to go to the church:

- food storage in cans
- food storage in buckets
- triage kits KM-1 & KM-2 from CERT cache
- 2 backboards
- 2 stretchers
- Can the church take food storage in bottles and soft packages?*
If so box up as much as we can and send it to the church.
If not still box it up and put it in the trailer.

in the trailer:

food:

- all 72-hour backpacks and kits
- coolers packed with refrigerated/frozen items
(*we will need the coolers later for storing of freshly hunted game*)
- boxes packed with "soft" non-refrigerated foods that the church will not take
- cans of seeds
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shelter and heat:

- large green Kirkham's family tent
- largest nylon tent for storage of supplies
- 6- large tarps (10' x 14')
- sleeping bags for each person
- air mattresses

 - 1- toothbrush
 - 2- tubes of toothpaste (large)
 - 1 or more rolls of floss
- all water filters and filtration kits
- Berkefeld water filter and extra ceramic filters
- all activated carbon boxes
- bung wrench
- 2- 55 gallon water barrels (empty)
- water pumps for 55 gallon barrels
- bottles of ammonia
- FHP's (girl stuff)
- all of the toilet paper we can stuff in the cracks
- baby wipes
- cotton swabs
- 2 bolts of flannel material (*to be used as TP*)
- 3 plungers (*for clothes washer in buckets*)
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cooking:

- all Dutch ovens
- cast iron skillets & griddles & bread molds
- camp ovens
- cooking grill for fire
- 200 lbs. charcoal
- charcoal lighter fluid
- hand wheat grinders (2)
- mess kits for everyone (*should be in 72-hour kits*)
- hand mixer/pitchers
- camp chuck box with everything in it
- camp chef stove
- all boxes of plastic Zip-lok bags
- Sterno and Sterno stoves
- 5 gallon can of kerosene in bike shed
- 5 gallon jug of rubbing alcohol in shed
- several alcohol stoves
- all small propane cylinders
- Dutch oven table
- 8' fold up table from shed
- plastic table cloths
- barbeque utensils
- Dutch oven tripod for fires
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medical:

- first aid kit from Master bedroom
- medicine bag & box from under bed
- all bottles of potassium iodide

- 1- heavy winter coat for each person
- 1- light coat or jacket for each person
- 2- sweatshirts for each person
- 1- set of winter gloves and hats for each person
- 1- set of long-johns for each person
- 1- set of Sunday wear for each person
- 6- sets of heavy duty clothes for each person (pants, shirts, and undergarments)
- 12- pr. socks for each person
- 1- pr. of heavy shoes or boots for each person
- 1 pr. snow boots for each person
- 1- pr. of sneakers for each person
- 6- pr. of work gloves for each person
- all bandanas and handkerchiefs
- 1- baseball cap or full brimmed hat of each person
- temple clothes
- 2 bolts of extra heavy duck canvas
- 2 bags of batting for quilts
- 2 bolts of denim material
- complete sewing kit
- plastic ponchos for each person
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safety:

- 12 boxes of dust masks (a case)
- 2 pr. goggles for each person
- all gas masks and filters
- radiation meters
- other radiation detection equipment
- whistles for each person
- pest control devices and sprays (*i.e. mousetraps, etc.*)

light and electricity - (Tupperware in storage room):

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in truck on people laps:

- all practical guns and ammunition
- windup/battery/solar powered radios
- FRS and HAM radios (*battery powered*)
- lap top computer
- Topo! software CD disks
- backup drive from work (*on top of computer*)
- hard drive from home computer (*at all costs the above 2 must go or be destroyed*)
- back up and program CD's from safe (genealogy and scrapbook CDs)
- briefcase
- everyone's scriptures
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put in safes (not going with us):

- family pictures and scrapbooks

If the dog can go - then in the truck:
